

Empty Shelves at the Salvation Army!

Lew Gwyn is a parishioner here who is in charge of bringing the food from our church to the Salvation Army Pantry. Along with his wife Clare, he has tirelessly carted hundreds of pounds of food to them each week in their car. Here is his report.

"On Monday, we delivered the haul to the Salvation Army. Monday is just a stocking day, and the pantry is not open for distribution. As you might recall, there was about 90 pounds of sauce that St. Augustine's donated, which was about three dozen jars or one size or another.

We had occasion to go back over there Tuesday afternoon, and we were astonished: On Tuesday morning, and early in the afternoon, 56 people had come for food. Now, many were homeless with no ability to cook, so they did not get things like spaghetti or sauce. However, what we saw was that ALL of the sauce was gone, along with much of the pasta and PB. As people can only use the pantry once a month, it is immediately clear just how great the

need is.

It is not reasonable to expect our little parish to give more than this amazing quantity of food. But I do think it is important for them to know just how much their generosity is appreciated. Everyone there is amazed by what we bring in every Monday, and it is appreciated beyond our ability to give thanks!" - Lew Gwyn

While this is not a ride at Disney World, it is a fantastic and dramatic end to Elijah's ministry on earth, and also a powerful segue into passing the prophetic baton to his successor, Elisha. In this week's Old Testament lesson, we continue with "Part II" of last week's story and fast forward to Elijah's transition to heaven. Elijah had asked Elisha what he could do for him before he, Elijah was taken away. Elisha boldly asks for a "double portion" of Elijah's spirit! Elijah replies: "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not." (2 Kings 2:10-11) It is interesting to note that Elijah spoke of Elisha's need to be able to see in order to receive what he asked for. Elijah even went as far to say that if Elisha couldn't see Elijah being taken up to heaven, that Elisha would not be able to receive what he requested in order to fulfill his mission and purpose as the next prophet of Israel.

The Role of Spiritual Sight

We do not need to be prophets to "see" what God wants us to see. Being able to see what God shows us will empower us for the life and ministry that the Holy Spirit guides each one of us into. It helps us to move forward and make wise decisions in our everyday lives; for ourselves and others. If we are not

able to see what God wants us to see, it is hard to move ahead. Spiritual sight allows us to consciously partner with the Holy Spirit to properly discern the pathway that He is leading us on. In this way we can take action with God's help in new situations, uncertain conditions and the transitions of life.

After Elisha saw the chariot taking Elijah into heaven, he then acted in faith by picking up Elijah's mantle off the ground and striking the water with it, as he had seen Elijah do before being taken up in the whirlwind. Elijah's "mantle" can represent "identity", as Elisha was asking for a portion of "Elijah's spirit." (2 Kings 2:9) We too might have to pick up a new "mantle" (identity) that the Holy Spirit presents to us in order for us to accept the new realities in our lives and new roles that He is guiding us into. From a practical standpoint this could be anything from accepting a new job, leaving an old one, changes in relationships, becoming a new parent, becoming a caregiver for an elderly family member, or navigating through the passing of a loved one. It could also appear as new talents, new uses for old talents, accepting new responsibilities and releasing old ones. It will always necessitate a new way of *looking at ourselves* and acting according to what we are shown.

This week in our Scriptures Paul says, "If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit." (Galatians 5:25) And since the fruit of the spirit "is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control", we know that "there is no law against such things." (Galatians 5:22-23) This means following the Spirit will always be the right action and will give us the right results as evidenced by the "fruit" listed above.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus says "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62) Sight figures prominently in our ability to follow (or not follow) God. Whatever we see is what we will follow. Being able to see what God is showing us will bolster our confidence moving through unknown territory, knowing that we are following His lead. On the contrary, if we are looking back and resisting the new, we can become stuck and unable to make the changes that we need to. But we can always rest assured that Jesus is always at work in our lives and the Holy Spirit will give us everything that we need to move forward. With their help, life can become more than just a "wild ride" out of control. It can instead become a divinely orchestrated walk as we navigate our challenges in a way that will ultimately be a blessing to us as well as those around us.



"From Pentecost Forward" - by Bishop Justin Holcomb (Bishop of the Diocese of Central Florida)

Bishop Justin tells us in his article, "The primary task of the people of God is to bear witness to his great deeds. The first disciples were charged to bear witness to the risen Christ, whom they had seen with their eyes. This witness would begin in Jerusalem, but would move outward to "the end of the earth." In these verses, Jesus does not command his disciples to perform certain rituals, to act according to certain rules or to refrain from certain activities. He promises them that they would testify to his power when the Holy Spirit came upon them."
