
International Coastal Cleanup Day



Looking to Deepen Your Faith?

Sunday Morning Christian Education starts September 10!

On **Sunday mornings at 9 am** in the Library, and running through October 1, we will engage in a book study on "The Great Divorce" by C.S. Lewis. We will do four chapters a week, the first two weeks; and then three chapters, the last two weeks. You can buy this book on <u>Amazon</u>.

What is "The Great Divorce?" George MacDonald describes it as "a theological fantasy of an imaginary bus trip from Hell to the foothills of Heaven, where the ghosts of Hell meet the spirits of Heaven. This companion to 'The Screwtape Letters' explores how our pride and self-will act to separate us from God. No, there is no escape. There is no Heaven with a little of Hell in it - no plan to retain this or that of the devil in our hearts or our pockets. Out Satan must go, every hair and feather."



Sunday School

St. Augustine's Sunday School meets on all but the first Sunday of the month, during the 10 am service. Children in Kindergarten through 6th grade gather in our classrooms down past the Old Parish Hall, in the education wing of the church. Raising the Roof!

With all the wild rain we have had lately, how wonderful it is to have a new roof over our heads! The construction was an arduous process that was spearheaded by Steve Connell. There were four bids, each requiring comprehensive review, discussion among the vestry, questions back-and-forth to the vendors, and final discernment. Total Roofing was selected in part because they actually manufactured the roof panels onsite rather than depend

on suppliers. They also had sufficient manpower to do the job quickly. On the first day there were over a dozen workers on site. Wouldn't you know that pulling all the old roof off unfortunately coincided with some of our record rainfall, requiring the staff to break out the buckets to catch water stemming from a host of new leaks. It also required the replacement of over 60 ceiling tiles.




