the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

WE BELIEVE IN ONE LORD, JESUS CHRIST

the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God; begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

WE BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

The Relationships of the Trinity and Us

Whenever we hear about "the Trinity", we are usually told that it is a "mystery"; something that can't be explained except in the broadest of terms within a "threefold nature" of Father, Son and Holy Spirit who are "one" in purpose and are all in complete harmony with each other. We experience this "threefold nature" in different ways, but the Trinity and how it operates in our own lives can be summed up in one word - "Relationships".

Jesus was always talking about his relationship with His Father, God. Later toward the end of His ministry, Jesus talks about His relationship to the Holy Spirit, and also what the nature of the Holy Spirit's relationship will be to us, as well as through us.

God the Father is the Creator of all things and throughout the Old Testament, we see that the Father is constantly focused upon drawing near to us, so that we may be in "right relationship" with Him. But from the very beginning, we separated ourselves from God, and that separation was maintained until Jesus came to earth.

Jesus comes to us as our Redeemer, the one who is sent to restore and repair our relationship with God through His life, death and resurrection. Jesus' life and entire ministry centers around bringing humanity back into that relationship with God that had been given away at the very beginning. He spent His time on earth teaching, healing, and ultimately demonstrating that perfect love with His death and restoring us to God through His resurrection. After His resurrection, He then commissions us to carry on His work through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit has many names, such as Comforter and Advocate, among others. Now that Jesus has returned to the Father and has restored us to right relationship with Him, the Holy Spirit comes along side of us to empower us for the work of ministry as an extension of Jesus and enables us to live in full relationship with all three "persons". While God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit are not all the same being, they are all of the same "substance". They are commonly referenced as the "Three in One" who all operate as one.

Every week we affirm the presence and the work of the Trinity in our lives through the Nicene Creed that we pray as part of our Sunday services. We start with "We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty..." We then affirm that Jesus Christ is "God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father." Later we pray that "We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son, he is worshiped and glorified."

While the concept of the Trinity can be very confusing, the one thing to remember is that they are all "one" with each other. Now as believers, we are able to be "one" with them - which unites all facets of these relationships which are never at odds with one another through one perfect network that, if we allow it, will continually draw us into life that is filled with the love and purpose of God.




Sunday School meets **Sunday at 10 am** in the last classroom at the end of the hall in the

News & Notes



Music for Trinity Sunday

Organ Music for the Festival of the Holy Trinity is built around the Trinitarian hymn *All Glory be to God on High*. The prelude at 8:00 and 10:00 am is a set of variations on this tune by Johann Gottfried Walther, a first cousin and almost exact contemporary of J.S. Bach. This sort of variation set on a hymn tune is known as a *chorale partita*. These partitas are a standard part of the organ repertoire, and have been composed from the sixteenth century up through the present time. The postlude at 10:00 is a setting of the same hymn by Georg Boehm.

The anthem at 10 am, *Prayer to the Trinity*, by Michael Bedford, (b.1949) begins with three solo sections, each a prayer to one of the Trinity, sung by one of our section leaders. These are followed by a three-part cannon sung by the entire choir, each voice representing one of the Trinity. The composer is currently organist/choirmaster of St, John's Episcopal Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma.




