



Where Do You Find God?

This week's spiritual armchair adventure takes us to the Finger Lakes in New York State by way of a heart-warming faith story shared by parishioner Stuart Weismiller. Read on!

Homecoming: Pentecost, Peace, and Fr. Phil May 28, 2023

It has been eight months since we were in our summer church home in Branchport, NY. There is one blinking spotlight in town, surrounded by rolling hills, farms, vineyards, and a fragrance of manure in the air. The 30-minute drive from our house to Saint Luke's Episcopal Church is well worth the journey.

First, the setting is that of a Hallmark movie - a small brick church built in 1866 with eight pews on each side, an upright piano and a keyboard, a small altar, stained glass windows, and a certain Moravian feel. Fr. Phil, the part-time rector, Rick the volunteer keyboard player, and the roughly 40 regular parishioners complete this "Hallmark ready" cast. Fr. Phil is probably 75, tall, slightly balding, wearing Khaki shorts, topsiders, and his clerical collar. As the story goes, the parish organist died, so a parishioner named Rick taught himself to play the keyboard in his spare time. Parishioners take turns mowing the lawn and cleaning the church.

The Parish house is three doors down the street. It was left to the church by the black residents who moved there during the time of the Underground Railroad. These parishioners were grateful to St. Luke's for their hospitality. Once a month we have a splendid potluck supper at the parish house. Parishioners bring their own plates and silverware because there is not a dishwasher, along with enough food and wine to feed all of Yates County.

Before the Sunday service began on Sunday, May 28th, Father Phil said: "Well, it looks like the bus from Florida just returned half of our parish!" And what a spiritual homecoming Pentecost was. The church was full of hugs, chatter,

love, and joy over being reconnected. There were 5 dogs of questionable lineage in various pews glued to their dutiful owners, including Crockett Weismiller. The keyboard player was absent, so the hymns got off to a slow, off-key start and didn't really pick up until a self-appointed choir appeared up front during the offering. Perhaps, the most entertaining part of every service is the "Peace." Everyone gets up to greet each other, starting with pew one and reaching all the way back to the coffee hour Tupperware and paper plates. Peace has been known to last over 20 minutes.

The post-collection announcements start with Fr. Phil asking who has a birthday, anniversary, or other topic to share. There was one birthday, followed by a prayer. Then, Fr. Phil's wife Polly was escorted to the Nave where her husband stood with prayer book in hand. It was their wedding anniversary, and the congregation was ready to share in their celebration.

Polly, also an ordained minister, met Phil in divinity school many years ago and co-ministered with him at Kent School in Kent, CT, along with parishes in New Jersey and outside of Chicago. They have two grown children, a daughter who is an artist living in Brooklyn with a two-year-old son, Vinny. They also have a son Martin, who is very troubled and recently admitted to a high-security mental institution in Buffalo NY.

To complete this complex picture, Polly has suffered from dementia since we have known her and is always accompanied by a fellow parishioner. She is impeccably dressed, by Phil, down to a beautiful necklace. The two hugged, had an anniversary blessing, and she was escorted back to her pew, not knowing what had happened. The curse of an empty spouse after all these years. It doesn't seem fair. Father Phil exudes God's love to every person who crosses his path. Parishioners leave each Sunday feeling nourished, loved, and part of a very real community of faith.

Homecomings are bittersweet. Next week the service will be held outside in Gloria's Garden and there is a potluck or two in our future. Thanks be to God. I am truly blessed to have two welcoming church communities in my life!

"update."


3. One last step ... Go back to "Profile & Settings" and click on "Directory Profile." Click next to "Include profile photo" and this will publish it to the directory.
