
Stewardship Campaign 2026!

On **Sunday, November 2**, St. Augustine's begins its 2026 Stewardship Campaign—a time to pause, reflect, and give thanks for the many blessings God has shared with us. Together, as a community of faith, we continue to answer His call and support the work we are called to do.

Stewardship packets will be available in the Narthex at all three services. If you are unable to pick up your stewardship packets this weekend, you will receive it by mail next week. If you don't receive one, you may request one from the parish office. Sunday, November 16th is the date by which we ask you to submit your pledge cards to the parish office. If you prefer, you can pledge online

"Use it or Lose it!"

Have you ever heard the saying "The rich get richer and the poor get poorer?" Seems unfair, right? Yet, when we don't use what we have, it becomes wasted and is as if we never had it. We have all also heard the expression "Use it or lose it!" How many times have we stopped an activity, no longer utilized an outlet for expressing a talent, or had simply gotten lazy and refrained from "practice"? Usually, we will find that when we try to resume that activity, our skills are rusty at best or even non-existent at worst. It takes that much longer to get ourselves back to the place where we can do the activity again with the same level of competence at which we were able to do it before.

We can even hoard things, just because they "might" be useful one day. The result is clutter which can render movement impossible. This also happens when food in the refrigerator spoils, because we were waiting for exactly the right time to use it. The end result in both cases is a resource wasted.

But what does all of this have to do with this week's Gospel lesson? Jesus is telling a parable about those who freely use what they have been given, and those who hoard what tiny little bit they have and do nothing, rendering it useless. On the surface it looks very unfair, since the person who had the least got what he had taken away from him, and the people who had the most got a lot more! But, let's take a closer look at the servant who was fearful and was also classified as "lazy and wicked" (Matthew 25:29). First, that servant was controlled by his fear, and renders his resource useless by taking the easiest action possible by burying it in the ground. Then he insults the Master! At that point, the Master takes it back and gives it to the servant who had the most and was able to extract the highest value for the resource.

This week is all about "stewardship" and how we as servants are "stewarding" what we have been given. How many times have we fearfully held on to what little bit we have had, afraid that there will never be any more and sabotaged ourselves in the process? How many times have we said, "if I had just" (fill in the blank) and would have had so much more? How many times have we wasted our time, opportunities, potentials in seed form, and countless chances to allow God to direct our financial life?

This week, as we concentrate on Stewardship for our church, let us also examine the ways that we steward all of our resources, whether it be money or possessions, our abilities and talents, and even our relationships with our families or others. What changes can we make that will truly maximize the use of our resources and allow God to direct that process by how we give?



Looking to Deepen Your Faith?




Newcomer's Class Is Now In Session!




