TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor... but go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

LUKE 14:8-11

"Humility - God's Equalizer"

How many times have we heard about the need to be humble in life? What does true humility mean? Is it always putting yourself last, or does it mean more in the context of the attitudes in one's heart in general?

An AI definition of "humble" is as follows: "As an adjective, it describes someone not proud or arrogant, or something that is low in rank, quality, or status." The definition of humility according to Dictionary.com is: the quality or condition of being humble; modest opinion or estimate of one's own importance, rank, etc.

So, what is true humility? We often hear about "false humility" which is defined as "insincere self-deprecation or modesty displayed to gain

attention, validation, or personal advantage, and it is a form of pride disguised as weakness." The definition goes on to say "Unlike true humility, which reflects an accurate self-view and gives glory to a higher power or acknowledges one's source of gifts, false humility focuses on the self and serves ulterior motives." So, by that definition, true humility is the ability to know that we are not the source of our talents and giftings, but rather that we are to give the glory to God. We are to recognize God as the source of all our blessings and to not rely on ourselves alone. When we give the glory to God, we then take the focus off of ourselves which can then help us see ourselves in proper perspective and circumvent the need to put our own objectives first above everything else.

Jesus talks about humility in this Sunday's readings and tells us not to overestimate our own importance. He suggests that we do that by putting ourselves in last place, so that we can only be promoted and not demoted because we were focused on ourselves and our own aggrandizement. This story reminds us not to jockey for position when it comes to opportunities, friends, or material possessions. We must bring God into every conversation we have with ourselves concerning our motives and examine our reasons for wanting to take an ambitious action that could be construed as self-serving.

There are many ways that humility can be employed. Humility is one of the ways that God can "level the playing field" as the humble do have a way of rising to the top of many situations as they concentrate on the greater good, not just their own, and especially as they look to God for direction. Sometimes God has us take the "long way around" to a goal. Frequently by being meek and non-aggressive in pursuing particular actions, in time God can bring the blessings of a situation back to us at the right time. In some cases it can mean not getting the "right job" immediately, but a better one later, and one that we didn't have to fight to get. It can mean allowing someone else to win an argument, especially if it allows peace in the home that would have otherwise been disrupted over something that would later prove to be insignificant. Sometimes, it is giving an advantage to someone else when God directs one to do so. Most of the time, it is simply about choosing not to have a "me first!" attitude or allowing oneself to be puffed up with arrogance and looking down on others. It's more about looking to God, and giving someone else the benefit of the doubt, or the benefit of a leg up, even if we don't personally agree with or like someone. We choose to leave the result in God's hands and do our best to move forward trusting in His providential goodness.




