

Epiphany 4 - The Beatitudes

Blessed be the...
meek **merciful**
poor in spirit *ones that mourn*
ones who hunger and **PERSECUTED**
thirst after righteousness *pure in heart*
peacemakers

"Blessed Are" - The Beatitudes

A lot has been said about the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12) – a set of teachings by Jesus also called “The Sermon on the Mount.” While there is some discussion about how many Beatitudes there are, it is generally agreed that there are eight of them. These are all statements which begin with the words “Blessed are”. They are then followed by teachings about the “salt of the earth” and “the light of the world” (see Matthew 5:13-16). All of these teachings are supposed to guide us into what Jesus says that we should *be* if we accept these truths and live them out in our own lives.

The Beatitudes have been described in this way – that these are the “be” attitudes. These series of statements are telling us how to “be”. Some of the statements are outwardly encouraging, yet some very much fly in the face of what we have been taught in our culture. People don’t usually consider the “meek” anything more than doormats, and most would prefer the teaching of “an eye for an eye” rather than “Blessed are you when people revile you and

persecute you." Yet with each of these statements, Jesus tells us that we will be blessed in that as we are "poor in spirit", meek, merciful, peacemakers, or persecuted because we follow Him rather than the world, that we will be called the children of God, and receive certain things such as the kingdom of heaven and inheriting the earth. He also will give comfort when we need it, mercy, and the ability to see God. We will have our hunger and thirst for Him quenched by His presence.

This week, how might the Holy Spirit guide and encourage us through these teachings? Through which attribute(s) might God be trying to reach us right now - to be?

Ash Wednesday "Imposition of Ashes" Services




Children on the Altar






