The Fourth Sunday After Pentecost

Should we continue in sin
in order that grace may abound?

BY NO MEANS!

How can we who died to
sin go on living in it?

Romans 6:1-2

"By no means!"

In this Sunday's Epistle, Paul asks a question: *"Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound?"* (Romans 6:1) Recently, we have been hearing about how "righteousness" is a gift to us from God – not based on behavior, but on our relationship to God. So, it is easy to come to the conclusion that what we *do* doesn't matter. Technically, that could be seen as true, according to what we have heard about being "justified by faith." However, if we really yield to the Holy Spirit within us, "continuing to sin" will be a direct conflict of interest and should give us reason to pause.

Paul emphatically agrees, as his next statement is *"By no means!"* He continues, *"How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ... If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."* (Romans 6:2-4) What Paul is saying is if we are in Christ, then our corrupt nature was crucified in Him. When Jesus rose from the dead, we too were raised up in His righteousness which took the place of that corrupt nature. So, no matter what we *do*, God's righteousness has been imparted to us, and is not based on our performance.

Now Paul admonishes, *"The death [Jesus] died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus."* (Romans 6:10-11) If we are to emulate Jesus, we need to consider that sinning was not an option for Him. A lifestyle of sin should not be an option for us either if we truly have His nature in us. Jesus voices a similar sentiment – *"Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."* (Matthew 10:39)

Jesus promises that if we put our old ways aside to “take up our cross” (Matthew 10:38) and follow Him, He promises that the life we “find” will be much greater and more meaningful than the life we left behind. This is not easy and requires vigilant monitoring of ourselves, our actions, our decisions, and our motives. But as we truly engage in relationship with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we may find ourselves coming more into alignment with heavenly objectives, even when we have not yet perfected living out the life of Christ in ourselves.

Sunday School

Pentecost

This week in Sunday School, we will conclude our journey through the post-resurrection stories of Jesus as we learn about Pentecost from Acts 2:1–21. Throughout the past several weeks, the children have followed Jesus' followers from the Road to Emmaus, to the restoration of Peter, to the Great Commission, and the Ascension. Now we arrive at the moment when God's promise is fulfilled.

Before Jesus returned to heaven, He told His disciples to wait in Jerusalem because God would send them a Helper—the Holy Spirit. The disciples trusted Jesus and waited faithfully, even though they did not know exactly when or how God's promise would come true. Then, on the day of Pentecost, something extraordinary happened. The disciples heard a sound like a mighty rushing wind, saw what looked like tongues of fire resting on each person, and were filled with the Holy Spirit.

As we explore this story together, the children will learn that Pentecost is often called the Birthday of the Church because it marks the beginning of the disciples boldly sharing the Good News with the world. We will also discover that Pentecost was already an important Jewish festival, which is why people from many different nations had gathered in Jerusalem. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, those visitors were able to hear God's message in their own languages, showing that God's love is for all people everywhere.

This lesson reminds us that God always keeps His promises. Just as the Holy Spirit gave the disciples courage, wisdom, and strength, God continues to guide and help His people today. Pentecost teaches us that we are never alone and that God equips us to share His love with the world through our words and actions.

As we conclude our post-resurrection series, we will celebrate the incredible journey we have taken together—from the empty tomb on Easter morning to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Through every lesson, we have been reminded that Jesus keeps His promises, walks beside His people, and calls us to share His love with others.

Our final Sunday School gathering before summer break (next Sunday) **will be a special celebration party.** No lesson is planned for that day as we take time to celebrate a wonderful year of learning, growing, praying, and serving together. We are so proud of how much the children have grown in their faith and look forward to celebrating all that God has done in their lives this year.

As we begin our summer break, we pray that the children carry these lessons in their hearts and continue growing in faith. We look forward to continuing our journey together when Sunday School resumes in August as we learn, grow, and discover God's promises together.

Join us again in August!

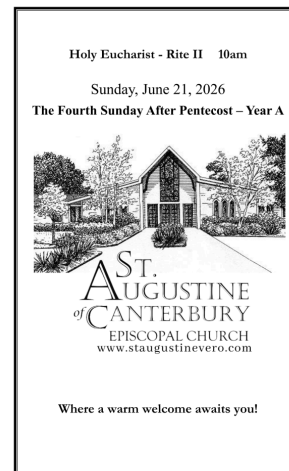

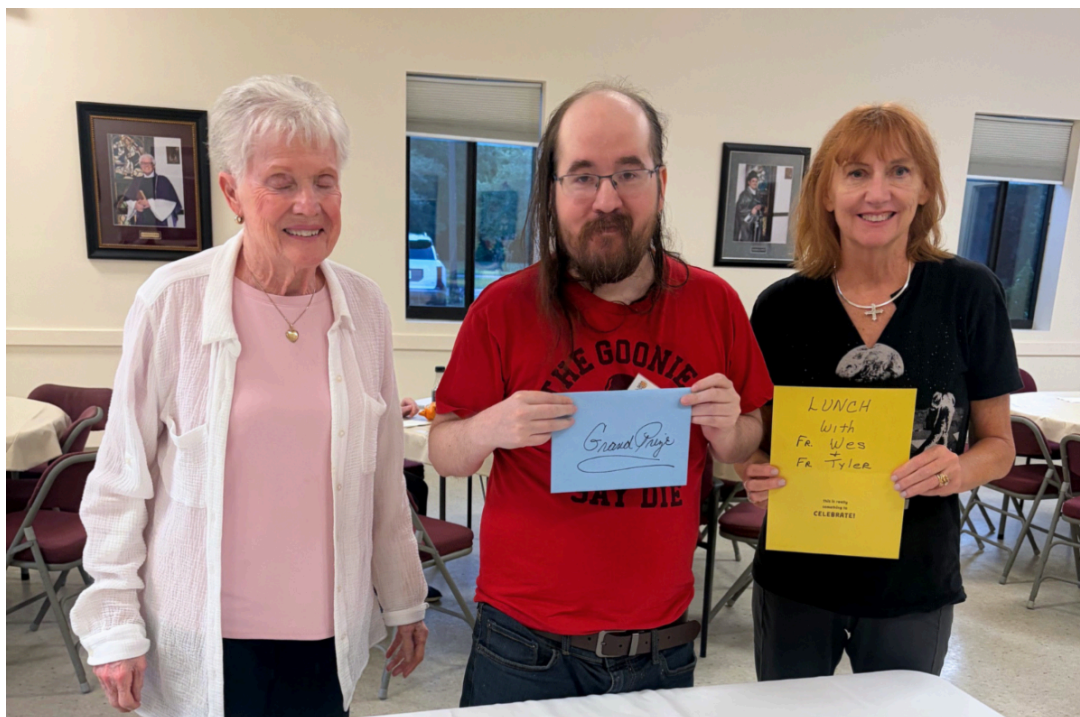
We wanted to extend our heartfelt thanks for hosting the recent blood drive on June 13th, 2026. Your support and commitment truly made a life-changing difference.

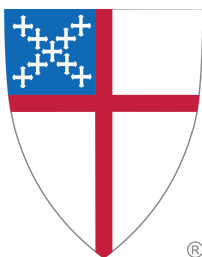
Calling All Singers!

A New Episcopal Church Initiative For Our Veterans



Dear Diocesan Family,

Earlier this year, LTC Rob Soeldner, (USA Retired and St. George's, The Villages) and The Rev. Canon Ellis Brust were appointed to serve on a new commission of The Episcopal Church focused on ministry with veterans, active-duty service members, and their families. We are grateful to Bishop Ann Ritonia, Suffragan Bishop for Armed Forces and Federal Ministries, and a veteran of the United States Marine Corps, for this appointment and for her leadership in this important work.

Our first step as a Commission is both simple and significant: we are seeking to better recognize and understand the presence of veterans and military families in our parishes. To assist the Commission in this work, **we are asking every parish to invite veterans, active-duty service members, and the families of each, to complete a brief survey** (link below). This will help us understand:

- Who are the veterans and military families in our churches

- What kinds of support are already bearing fruit
- Where there are opportunities for deeper care
- How can local churches build connections to local military installations

Your responses will help shape how the Church strengthens this ministry in the years ahead—so that our care is attentive, faithful, and grounded in the Gospel.

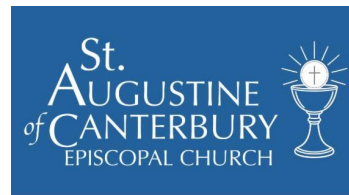
