## Easter 6 - God's Peace

In just about every place that we can think of, we hear about "God's Peace"



and how it is different than "our" peace or the "world's" peace. This type of peace seems very hard to find or to lay hold of in the frenetic and fast paced times of today. Yet people in biblical times also found this peace very difficult to come by as well, otherwise Jesus would not have been talking about it.

Jesus told us that He "leaves" his peace with us, and that He gives it to us (John 14:27). So, this should mean that we should already have it and don't need to go looking for it out in the

world. He makes it clear that we will not find peace there. And yet how many times that is exactly what we try to do; to find peace in a place that is outside of ourselves, and we begin to expect that something or someone will provide us that peace. Some of the places that we "look" for that peace might be in food, good health, good looks, friends, spouses, job performance, money, recognition or accolades, volunteer work, or any other place where we might develop an expectation of what we believe will make us feel better and solve all our problems.

While all of these things are certainly not bad in and of themselves and may provide us with a sense of security and well being, Jesus isn't talking about any of this either. He is talking about being able to enter into a place of peace that is not dependent on what is going on around us. Yes, it can be extremely difficult to choose peace in the throes of a medical trial, when our loved ones are ill, when we are broke and don't see a way out, when our friends and family are angry at us, when our job is anything but peaceful, when we have no job, and when people are tugging on us to do things that we would rather not volunteer to do. It is very easy to become angry, resentful, despondent and fearful, and it can happen very quickly in the blink of an eye.

However, that becomes the moment for us to make a very conscious choice to stop continuing on those negative emotional trajectories and to "seek peace and pursue it" as Psalm 34:14 says. This is when we need to lay hold of the fact that Jesus said that He has already given this peace to us. Maybe the simple act of taking some deep breaths while focusing on "My peace I leave with you", is enough to begin a different thought process where we might be able to remember that Jesus also said that "I will not leave you orphaned, I will come to you" (John 14:18). Maybe as we grab onto that promise, the Holy Spirit will make His presence known and do what what only He does best, which is to comfort, guide, correct, and remind us of everything that Jesus has said, which then might then translate into insight and direction about our particular situation (see John 14 and 16).

Yes, it is true that Jesus said "In this world you will have trouble", however, the second half of that statement is "but be of good cheer, because I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). Because Jesus overcame, we too have the Overcomer in us who gives us His peace. With that peace, Jesus helps us to overcome. We can then begin to enter into the place where the peace of God passeth all understanding (Phil. 4:7) and is not based upon any human

circumstances or reasoning. While things may not change outwardly, this does allow us to move ahead in a new way knowing that we have not been left alone, and that through the peace of Jesus, the Holy Spirit will be with us and will be our Helper no matter what we might be facing.

the only source of blood for cancer patients, newborns and others in critical need. Contact: <u>Pam Wehrberger</u>


