"Rejoice!"

This week on the third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate "Gaudete" Sunday or "Rejoice Sunday" (as it is known in some circles) where we joyfully wait for the coming of Christ. We receive a little breath of fresh air as we read our wonderful first lesson from Isaiah this week. Instead of the "brood of vipers" from last week, we are treated to the return of the "ransomed of the Lord" with "everlasting joy on their heads" and we are promised that "sorrow and sighing shall flee away" (Isaiah 35:10) when our Messiah comes.

However, lest we become too giddy with our rejoicing, James also tells us that we must be patient, to "strengthen our hearts" and that we are not to "grumble against one another." (James 5:9) While it might sometimes be difficult, if we choose to focus upon JOY, the grumbling can be kept to a minimum with a little effort. Instead, let us take hold of our third Advent Wreath scripture which gives us a delightfully marvelous uplifting visual:

You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

Isaiah 55:12

Last Sunday, our children had a special role in worship as they served as acolytes on the altar. Even though we did not meet for Sunday School, the kids were still growing in their faith by helping lead the service and offering their time to God. It was wonderful to see their confidence, joy, and reverence as they served our church family.

This coming Sunday, we will continue our Advent journey by focusing on the meaning of the Second and Third Advent candles—Peace and Joy. The Candle of Peace reminds us that Jesus came to calm our hearts and guide us with His presence, even when life feels busy or uncertain. The pink Candle of Joy reminds us that the coming of Jesus fills the world with deep and lasting joy—not just happiness for a moment, but a joy that comes from knowing God is with us.







The holidays, although filled with family, friends and celebration, can be a stressful time of year under normal circumstances. For those who are alone, have lost a loved one or gone through a recent crisis, it can be emotionally difficult. Here are a few tips to get through the holidays if you are grieving or feeling "blue":

Acknowledge that the holidays will be different and may be emotional.

Be honest and tell people what you want to do for the holidays and what you don't want to do. Listen to yourself and communicate with friends and/or family what works for you.

Decide which traditions you want to keep and which you want to change. Maybe create a new tradition.

Don't feel guilty about skipping events if you are on overload. At the same time, if you are feeling lonely, reach out to a friend or fellow parishioner. Generally, people want to be of help.

Practice self care whether it be meditation, a walk, a massage; whatever soothes your soul. Try to get plenty of rest, eat healthy and limit alcohol intake.

Remember those you have lost. Sharing memories can often be therapeutic.

Consider volunteering by doing something kind for someone else, such as helping at a soup kitchen, delivering presents to the disadvantaged. It may lift your spirits by helping others.

Seek help if you are struggling. It may be helpful to join a support group or see a counselor or health professional. Don't be afraid to say YES to people who want to help and may offer their support.

St. Augustine of Canterbury prides itself in being a welcoming and caring faith community. If you know of someone who is in need of support, reach out to them. It's the best gift you can give!




