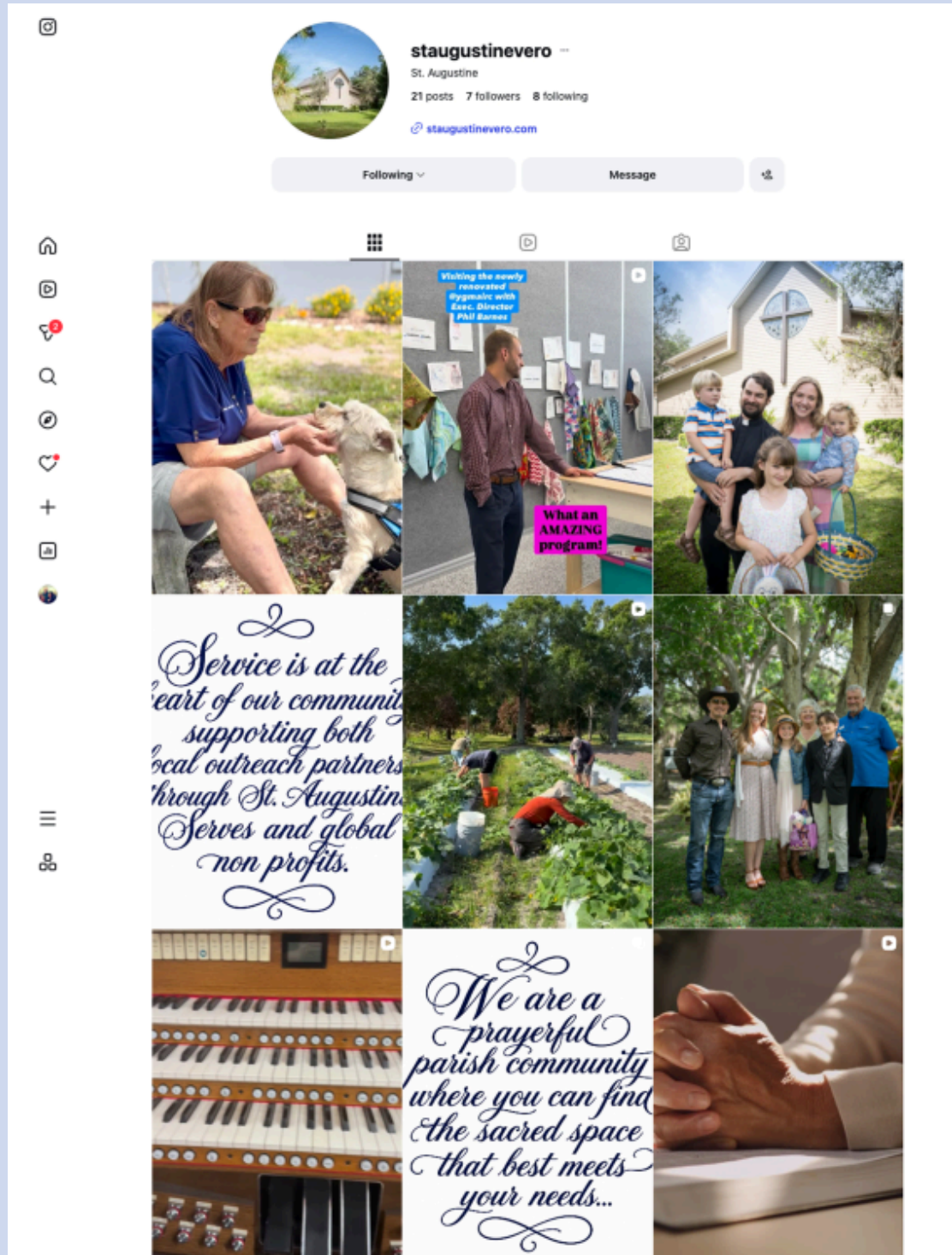

EASTER 7

All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one."

John 17:10-11

"What's mine is yours..."

We have all heard the saying "what's mine is yours". Husbands and wives say this to each other when they marry, and friends will say "My house is your house" to one another when offering hospitality. But in Jesus' prayer, he tells his Father that *"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me... all mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them."* (John 17:6-10) We are in Jesus and Jesus is in us? Jesus has been "glorified" in us? What does that really mean?

Paul tells us *"Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you are sharing Christ's sufferings, so that you may also be glad and shout for joy when his glory is revealed."* He further explains *"If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you."* (1 Peter 4:12-14). Because we have *believed* in Jesus that He was sent by the Father, we enter into both Jesus's sufferings and His ultimate victory on the cross. Everything that Jesus "is" and "has" is now also becomes "ours". We become one in Him and He in us. We also become one with the Father because of Jesus' oneness with us. Jesus even prays that we become "one with each other"! The culmination of these statements comes as result of when Jesus tells us ultimately *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth"*. (Acts 1:8)

Next Sunday we will experience the celebration of Pentecost – the outcome of that conversation that Jesus had before He "disappeared" from the sight of the disciples. We will witness the power of the Holy Spirit coming "as a rushing mighty wind", resting on the disciples as "tongues of fire". And we all know what happened next. Three thousand were converted in a single day, many people came to repentance, and the birth of the church exploded onto the scene with a bang. And we as believers are privileged to be part of that! Each of us in our own small way can reveal the glory of Jesus as we *believe*, as we witness, and as we give way to the Holy Spirit's power in us to help others.

Looking to Deepen Your Faith?



The Road to Emmaus

This week in Sunday School, our children will journey along the road to Emmaus and explore one of the most meaningful stories that took place after Jesus' resurrection. In this story, two disciples were walking together feeling confused, discouraged, and uncertain about all that had happened. As they traveled, Jesus came alongside them and walked with them—but at first, they did not recognize Him.

Together, we will talk about why the disciples may not have recognized Jesus right away and what this teaches us about faith, trust, and understanding God little by little. The children will learn that Jesus often works quietly and patiently in our lives, even in moments when we do not fully see or understand what He is doing.

As the story unfolds, the disciples' hearts begin to change as Jesus speaks with them and explains the Scriptures. Finally, when Jesus breaks bread with them, their eyes are opened, and they recognize Him. Through this powerful moment, we will reflect on how Jesus is still present with us today—in our questions, in our struggles, in our learning, and in the everyday moments of life.

Our takeaway message for the week is that we are never walking alone. Even when life feels uncertain or confusing, Jesus walks beside us, guiding us step by step and helping our hearts grow in faith and understanding. We can't wait to continue this journey together next week as we see what happened next in this incredible story.

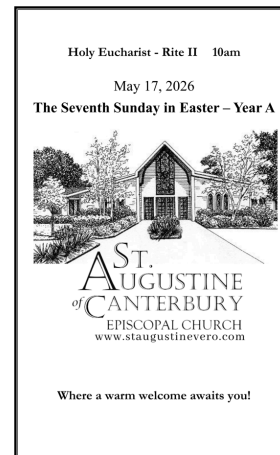

For most churches that end up closing, they cite the financial pressure of maintaining their buildings as the number one factor, while focus upon outreach and ministry slowly dwindle. When I look at our parish, I can certainly see how that could happen.

For this reason I have advocated for us to start a Building Maintenance Endowment Fund. I am now pleased to announce that we have received just under \$312,000 for our first gift. This is through the generosity of Bob and Connie Wood as well as their children Peter and Wendy. We are incredibly grateful for this gift and excited by the future possibilities for this parish.

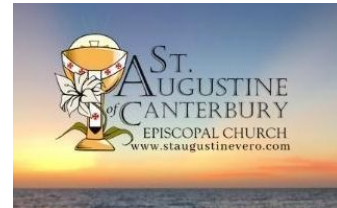

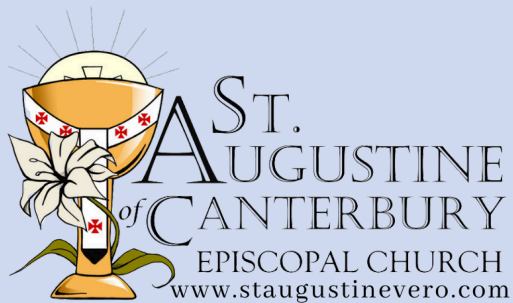
