

"I will pour out my Spirit"

This week we hear about a marvelous promise of God from the prophet Joel. The prophecy is all about the restoration of the people after they had been ravaged by famine, drought, and much hardship for a long time. First, we are told "I will repay you for the years that the swarming locust has eaten; you shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, who has dealt wondrously with you." (Joel 2:25-26) Then God says "afterward, I will pour out my spirit on all flesh" (Joel 2:28) and describes what will take place when that happens. The qualifier in this statement is the word ALL. God even says this applies to slaves both male and female, the lowest of the low - ALL will have the Holy Spirit poured out on them!

While all people may definitely be on board with eating plenty and being satisfied, most folks don't know quite what to do with the pouring out of the Spirit on all flesh! The word ALL here is key - ALL means you and me! One

might say, "Really? Even me? How can this be?" Some might even say, "I don't want a part of any of this. What is all this nonsense about prophesying, dreams and visions? I am a practical person, and this doesn't apply to me, nor do I want it to!" Yet, this is exactly what God means by the word "all".

Consider that every week many believers are asking for the Holy Spirit's help, but what they may not realize is that this is *all* part of the package! As believers who have received the Holy Spirit, He has already been "poured out" in us. While the dreams, visions and prophecies may seem a little too far-fetched for a lot of us, many can point to times when the Holy Spirit has helped with an encouraging word to someone, being "just the right thing" to have been said. Sometimes, we can receive an answer or get an impression that can help us resolve an issue, or we can receive a flash of insight that can only be attributed to the Holy Spirit's leading. There are some who will find that they can remember a Scripture for a particular situation in their lives and have that Scripture help them solve an issue, or bring about a "Godsized" solution to a problem. And yes, there are those who will "speak from the Spirit" as the Holy Spirit guides, as well as those who will "see" and receive a Spirit-filled revelation. All of this is biblical, and Paul talks about these gifts of the Spirit in 1 Corinthians 12.

Do not be afraid of these gifts, for they really are for ALL of us! They are for you, for me, the one person who we think is not capable of receiving a gift, and the one person that we really don't get along with. While we may not be able to "pick and choose" what "gifts" we have, we will be able to receive from the Holy Spirit just what He wants us to have and do, if we ask. Ask the Holy Spirit today how He has gifted you and ask for His help in exercising those gifts with wisdom and discernment. You'll be surprised at how simply He honors that request, how it strengthens one's spiritual faith journey, and how it helps to experience the joy of knowing that God is intimately involved in our lives.






Newcomer's Class Is Now In Session!



October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

It is also a time to lift up those currently going through treatment, celebrate those who are in remission and to serve as a reminder to all of us to be proactive because **early detection can save lives**.

PLEASE.....

- · Remember to get a yearly mammogram.
- · Check your breasts regularly for any lumps, thickening or swelling, redness, dimpling or discharge, change in size or shape, or pain in breast. Call doctor or be seen at a clinic; don't put off!
- Risk factors include: family history of breast or ovarian cancer, your personal history of breast problems, age (over 50), over weight or obese after menopause, not being physically active, taking hormones, drinking in excess, or inherited changes in your BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes.

If you are currently going through treatment, would like to be lifted up in prayer, receive Communion, need support or a listening ear, please let the office know or contact <u>Sally Munson</u>. Any questions regarding nutrition and diet, feel free to ask our Dietician <u>Phillippa Norman</u>.
