We are blessed to have a beautiful commercial kitchen in our parish hall and we are even more blessed to have countless volunteers that make it all run smoothly. From our kitchen managers and shoppers, Sunday morning coffee hour crews, cooks for major events, hospitality teams, to the clean up crews, we have numerous people working to allow us all to enjoy the fellowship we experience in that place. A few quick

reminders to us all to help out with that process.

- 1. Please do not bring food from home that you can't eat to the church in the hopes that we will use it on Sunday morning. It messes up our system, and we don't generally know where the food has come from so we do not serve it. Ninety nine times out of one hundred that food gets thrown away. Save yourself, and us, the trouble and just throw it away at home.
- 2. If you are a ministry leader or leading an event, please try to clean up the kitchen as much as possible when you are finished. If you have questions about what to do, reach out to the church office and we will try to point you in the right direction.

3. Last, but not least, please remember that we are trying to manage a lot of different groups and needs, along with our church budget. That means that sometimes we may not have exactly what you want or are used to having, but let's all try to be flexible and grateful for all the work that is done on our behalf.

Thank you all for helping to keep our kitchen clean, well organized, and a pleasant place for us all.




Please Donate for Jamaica Hurricane Relief

"They Shall Name Him Emmanuel"

This Sunday, fourth Sunday of Advent is all about Mary, how she was with child and about to bear a son, the Son who would save all of humanity. Much has been said about her obedience to take God at His word when the angel Gabriel told her that she, a virgin, would bear God's own son! While she did ask "How could this be?" - when she received the explanation from the angel about how it would happen, she simply said "Be it done unto me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

While that in itself is incredible, we should probably take a look at Joseph's role in all of this – that faced with what appeared to be a very disgraceful situation, he too also listened to an angel instead, just as Mary had. It was Joseph who chose to keep her for his wife and to raise a son that he himself did not father, so as to fulfill the Scriptures. Undoubtedly both Mary and Joseph had heard the prophesies handed down through the ages about the birth of the Messiah, that they were both able to listen and believe when angels gave them corroborating information that confirmed what had been spoken about for centuries, and that they were chosen as the vessels to be Jesus' earthly parents.

Emmanuel means "God with us". God is now with us because Jesus came into the world through the obedience of both Mary and Joseph to say "yes" to God. What incredible thing this Christmas might God present to each one of us to say "yes" to?

Fact: One in three of us will need a blood transfusion.





The holidays, although filled with family, friends and celebration, can be a stressful time of year under normal circumstances. For those who are alone, have lost a loved one or gone through a recent crisis, it can be emotionally difficult. Here are a few tips to get through the holidays if you are grieving or feeling "blue":

Acknowledge that the holidays will be different and may be emotional.

Be honest and tell people what you want to do for the holidays and what you don't want to do. Listen to yourself and communicate with friends and/or family

what works for you.

Decide which traditions you want to keep and which you want to change. Maybe create a new tradition.

Don't feel guilty about skipping events if you are on overload. At the same time, if you are feeling lonely, reach out to a friend or fellow parishioner. Generally, people want to be of help.

Practice self care whether it be meditation, a walk, a massage; whatever soothes your soul. Try to get plenty of rest, eat healthy and limit alcohol intake.

Remember those you have lost. Sharing memories can often be therapeutic.

Consider volunteering by doing something kind for someone else, such as helping at a soup kitchen, delivering presents to the disadvantaged. It may lift your spirits by helping others.

Seek help if you are struggling. It may be helpful to join a support group or see a counselor or health professional. Don't be afraid to say YES to people who want to help and may offer their support.

St. Augustine of Canterbury prides itself in being a welcoming and caring faith community. If you know of someone who is in need of support, reach out to them. It's the best gift you can give!
