

It is a tangible way to trust in the Lord's promise and provision, and it can be challenging. But at the very same time, there is no better place to be than resting in the promise of God, no matter what it brings. It is a privilege to walk through this stewardship season together as we grow in our trust in the Lord.

"The Silver is Mine and the Gold is Mine"

Does it ever really occur to us that we belong to God and that truly everything in our lives belongs to God also? It is so easy for us to get caught up in the concept of "mine". In fact, individual ownership is very much a part of this world's system. We "own" businesses, houses, land, clothing, intellectual "rights" to intangible property, and the list goes on. However, in this week's Old Testament lesson and all throughout Scripture, God is saying exactly the opposite. In God's economy we don't really "own" anything - everything belongs to God! We are just the "stewards", those who take care of what we have.

This week in our Old Testament lesson, God specifically says that "the silver is mine and the gold is mine" (Haggai 2:8). All of our finances belong to God! In this Scripture, God is telling the people about the temple He wishes to be rebuilt, of which there is no evidence yet. He says that He will provide the "treasures of the nations" to be at their disposal. It is such a great struggle to hand over the control of our finances to God, especially when we don't initially see any evidence of the end result. However, it is wise for us to consider that we rarely have all the answers, especially amid the volatility and vulnerability of the financial vehicles that we have grown to depend upon, such as our jobs, financial markets, and even spouses and other people. While none of these channels of income are guaranteed and can fail, God is the true source of our supply and does not fail us when we look to Him and put Him first in our finances. He will help us and guide us.

Much has been said about the "tithe" - the 10% of our financial income that belongs to God. While a "true" tithe seems a bit much for people to swallow, it has definitely been said that those who say they can't afford to tithe, cannot afford *not* to tithe! Likewise, the ones who say that they have too much to tithe are also in the same boat. When we tithe, we are placing control of our finances in God's hands, and trusting that God will not leave us bereft or without. The tithe is not just about giving to God, it is also about receiving the best that God has for us by putting Him first. Often, that can mean a rearrangement of priorities, but as we continue put God first, He will always prove to be our perfect provision in every circumstance, as He promised those in Haggai's day who were tasked with rebuilding the temple.

For those of us who are still praying about our pledge, let us consider pledging the full 10% in a spirit of radical trust while we ask for God's guidance and supernatural help to manage our finances. As we yield to His spirit, let us remember that Malachi 3:10-12 tells us: "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. I will rebuke the locust for you, so that it will not destroy the produce of your soil; and your vine in the field shall not be barren, says the Lord of hosts. Then all nations will count you happy, for you will be a land of delight, says the Lord of hosts."


Help "Clean-Up" Afterward!




St. Augustine's Newcomers Class Sundays in the Parish Library at 9:00 a.m.






