Palm Sunday and Holy Week

The Palm Sunday Readings are a bit of roller coaster; the triumphant entry degenerates into betrayal and ultimately, the death of Jesus. It is hard for us to imagine how it is that Jesus chose to die for us; for sinful humanity, for you and for me, and for those who are oblivious and ambivalent to their need for a Savior. Even for those of us who believe, it is extremely hard for us to fathom. While we certainly have heard of the lives of the martyrs of old, and even a few modern day ones, choosing to die for others is not something that we can readily resonate with - much less embrace, especially as Westerners.

However, starting this Palm Sunday, we will be entering what is called “Holy Week”, a time for us to observe and meditate upon the sequence of events starting with the arrival of Jesus in Jerusalem and leading up to his crucifixion, the tomb and the resurrection. This year, we are all invited to take some time on each of these days to contemplate on the extremely difficult journey of Jesus to the cross and death, as each day of Holy Week focuses on particular events. Our Holy Week services will be held on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings of next week.

HOLY WEEK MEDITATIONS

Monday of Holy Week

MONDAY, MARCH 30

Jesus enters into Jerusalem and drives out the money changers from the temple.

Tuesday of Holy Week

TUESDAY, MARCH 31

Jesus teaches in the temple where he predicts his betrayal .

Wednesday of Holy Week

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 1

On “Spy Wednesday”, Judas Iscariot betrays Jesus and the chief priests order his death. The service of “Tenebrae” is traditionally held on this day, featuring the gradual extinguishing of candles as readings and psalms are recited.

Maundy Thursday

THURSDAY, APRIL 2

Maundy Thursday is the day of “The Last Supper”, where Jesus washes his disciples feet. Please join us at our Maundy Thursday service this day at 5:30 pm.

Good Friday

FRIDAY, APRIL 3

This is the day of the crucifixion and death of Jesus on the cross. Our Good Friday service is held at 5:30pm.

Saturday of Holy Week

SATURDAY, APRIL 4

“Holy Saturday” focuses on Jesus in the tomb as we await his resurrection on Easter morning. Our service of the “Great Vigil of Easter” takes place at 7:30 pm, during which the tomb is found empty and becomes our first celebration of the resurrection of Jesus.

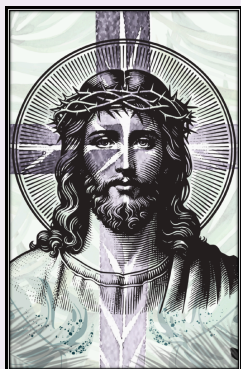

HOLY WEEK & EASTER SERVICES



Palm Sunday, The Sunday of the Passion SUNDAY, MARCH 28-29, 5:30 PM, 8 & 10AM SERVICES

This solemn day marks the beginning of Holy Week and the turbulent journey to the Cross. We begin by joining Jesus' triumphal procession into the city of Jerusalem with joyful "Hosannas!", and end with the confusion and fear that leads to the cross. At the end of each service the Passion will be read, and the congregation will be asked to maintain silence as they leave the church. Regular

Saturday and Sunday service times apply, and Coffee Hour will be held in the Parish Hall afterward.



Maundy Thursday

THURSDAY, APRIL 2, 5:30 PM

Maundy Thursday is the day that commemorates the Last Supper with Jesus and His disciples. The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin word *mandatum*, which means "commandment" and refers to Jesus's statement "*A new commandment I give unto you: That you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another.*" (John 13) This Scripture is what Jesus says in regard to the washing of one another's feet, which takes place during this service for all who wish to participate.



Good Friday

FRIDAY, APRIL 3, 5:30 PM

Good Friday is the day of the crucifixion and death of Jesus on the Cross. This service provides time for us as Christians to meditate on His ultimate sacrifice that opens the way for us to receive eternal life through His glorious resurrection. This service is very stark in comparison to Sunday services and does not include the Eucharist, yet is very meaningful in its austerity. The congregation will be asked to maintain contemplative silence both as they enter and exit the church.



The Great Vigil of Easter

SATURDAY, APRIL 4, 7:30 PM

This lesser known service is actually one of the most beautiful of all during the Church Year. It starts in with the lighting of a new fire (outside) and candlelight inside the church. The first part of the service in darkness features many readings to prepare us for the joyful and dramatic proclamation of "*Alleluia! Christ is Risen!*" which coincides with the dramatic turning on of all the lights in the church and culminates with a joyful Eucharist. Easter has officially begun!



Easter Sunday

SUNDAY, APRIL 5, 8 AM and 10 AM

This great service needs no introduction, as it is the church service most attended by Christians and non-Christians alike. Easter is the most joyous celebration of the Church as we rejoice over the defeat of death and the grave by the Resurrection of Jesus. This service will feature very joyful music at the 10 AM service including brass and timpani along with choir and organ.

As we walk through each station, we are gently preparing our hearts for the joy of Easter, when we celebrate the victory of life over death and the promise of new life in Christ.

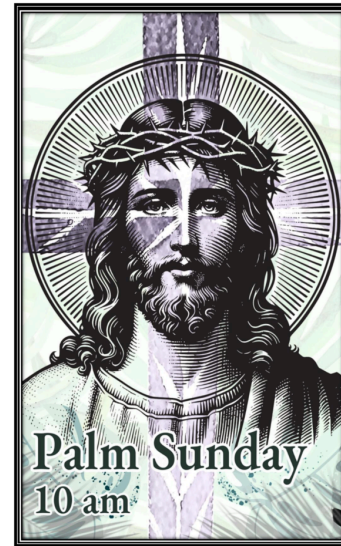

March is Colon Cancer Awareness Month

It's March! Time to talk turkey with the Gastroenterology Chick! I will try to not bore you with statistics and medical jargon.

Guess what? Colonoscopy is the only cancer screening technique that can actually prevent cancer, not just detect it.



I have been a gastroenterology nurse for 20 years. One of the biggest concerns people about having a colonoscopy is fear of being embarrassed. Never have I ever heard a health care professional comment on or joke about a patient during a colonoscopy. No one is interested in seeing your derriere. File that under the "seen one you've seen them all" category. I HAVE seen a wife take her husband's hand and cry upon finding out he has colon cancer. I have had people tell me, "I'm never having that done." Boy, are they misguided. Folks who say that have never seen someone suffering with colon cancer. Colonoscopies save lives. Got that? A 30 minute procedure CAN PREVENT CANCER .

Here is how: get a baseline colonoscopy at age 45. If you are over 45 and not had one, DO IT. Early detection of colon polyps is the key. Polyps are small but often precancerous growths in the colon. If your doctor finds polyps (which can only be found during a colonoscopy) they will be removed. Polyps gone, so is cancer risk. If you do not have a colonoscopy, and you have polyps, they most likely will develop in to colon cancer. Sorry, it is true. Colo -Guard, ultrasounds, virtual colonoscopies CANNOT remove polyps.

Now, let's get to the preparation. First, congratulate yourself for scheduling your colonoscopy! OK, the day before the procedure is no picnic. In fact, it's no food at all. And a kind of yucky but do-able drink. It is worth every gulp! The day of the procedure? It is relatively easy. And safe. You will be sedated during the procedure and will not feel a thing. You will wake up quickly, feel rested and you can eat as soon as you are discharged.

Want to make it even easier? I will tell you how. Starting now: Eat 30 grams of fiber daily. Fiber helps to keep your bowels moving and keeps your colon healthy. Don't smoke. Exercise. Easy on the red meat, partner! Doctors do not know exactly what causes colon polyps. Probably poor diet (lack of fiber, too much processed food.) Research shows it could be hereditary. Which is why, if you have a family history of colon cancer, you need to be tested earlier than age 45.

To underscore the importance of a screening colonoscopy, consider this: for men and women combined, colon cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths. More than 51,000 Americans die each year from colon cancer. That's it for statistics!

So no more excuses. Tell your family practitioner you want a referral for a screening colonoscopy.

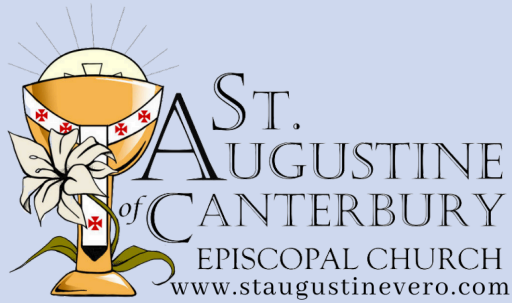
