

#### "Pray and do not lose heart"

This week in Sunday's Gospel, we hear about how God helps us when we cry out to Him, no matter what might be going on in our lives, or in the world. With all of the craziness that might be happening around us, it is easy to feel overwhelmed and feel that we might be in the midst of a situation where we can't possibly be helped, so "why bother?" But Jesus did not want his disciples to feel that way. He did not want them to look at the outward conditions; to give up, or give in to fear or discouragement.

In fact, Jesus uses a parable that illustrates that God doesn't care who you are, if you have faith in Him and cry out to Him day and night, that you will receive the help that you need, no matter how it looks. The example is that of a widow asking for justice from an unjust judge, which at first glance does not appear to be a possible scenario. How can one receive justice from one who is unjust? In this story, widow receives her justice, not because of the

fairness of the judge, but because she was persistent and did not take no for an answer! The unjust judges says not, "I will give her what she wants because it is fair", but instead "I will give her what she wants because I am tired of her coming to me with this. I will do it just so that I won't get worn out by her continual asking."

So what does this tell us? In the parable the Lord said "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night?" (Luke 18:6-7) In other words, How much more will we, having a relationship with God, receive help if we will simply be persistent and not give up? Here was a corrupt judge who had no relationship with the widow, other than she was coming to him continually with the same request. If the widow got results from an evil judge who had no regard for her personally, how much more will we receive help from an uncorrupt and perfectly just God who loves us, cares for us, and knows every hair on our heads? In the same passage, Jesus comments "And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Luke 18:8) Jesus knows that most people do not have the fortitude to continually resist fear and have unwavering faith in God's ability or willingness to help them, especially if the outward conditions are unfavorable or if it takes longer than expected. This is why he tells the disciples to "pray always and not lose heart." (Luke 18:1)

Do not give up! It is easy to become discouraged in prayer and feel like there is no movement in your situation. It is surprisingly easy to begin to doubt God's ability or willingness to help us. And yet, if we don't quit, Jesus tells us that we can be like the widow who receives her answer, just because she is persistent. This week in our Old Testement lesson, Jeremiah tells us that the Lord says "I put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people" and that "all will know the Lord, from the least of them to the greatest for I will forgive their iniquity and remember their sin no more". (Jeremiah 30:33-34) In light of that revelation, how can we not receive help from God?

There are just three days left to <u>sign up to walk</u> or <u>make your donation</u> to the "Making Strides" Breast Cancer Awareness Walk!


Cancer has touched many lives in our parish family. For this reason, St.




#### Newcomer's Class Starting Next Sunday, October 19

#### The Birth of Jesus in Bethlehem

This week in Sunday School, our children will hear the wonderful story of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. When Caesar Augustus called for a census, Mary and Joseph traveled to Bethlehem, even though Mary was about to give birth. With no room available at the inn, they found shelter in a humble stable, and there, the Son of God entered the world. Wrapped in swaddling cloths and laid in a manger, Jesus came not in wealth or power, but in humility and love. Nearby, angels appeared to shepherds in the fields, proclaiming the good news: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." The shepherds hurried to see the child and then joyfully shared the news with everyone they met.

Through this story, the children will see how God's greatest gift came in the most unexpected way. Jesus' birth reminds us that God is faithful to His promises and that His love reaches all people—rich and poor, powerful and lowly alike. Just as the shepherds rejoiced and shared the good news, we too are called to welcome Jesus with thankful hearts and share His love with others.

The birth of Jesus shows us that God's love is for everyone, and when we receive His gift with joy, we are moved to share the good news of Christ with the world.



#### October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

It is also a time to lift up those currently going through treatment, celebrate those who are in remission and to serve as a reminder to all of us to be proactive because **early detection can save lives.** 

PLEASE.....

- · Remember to get a yearly mammogram.
- · Check your breasts regularly for any lumps, thickening or swelling, redness, dimpling or discharge, change in size or shape, or pain in breast. Call doctor or be seen at a clinic; don't put off!
- Risk factors include: family history of breast or ovarian cancer, your personal history of breast problems, age (over 50), over weight or obese after menopause, not being physically active, taking hormones, drinking in excess, or inherited changes in your BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes.

If you are currently going through treatment, would like to be lifted up in prayer, receive Communion, need support or a listening ear, please let the office know or contact <u>Sally Munson</u>. Any questions regarding nutrition and diet, feel free to ask our Dietician <u>Phillippa Norman</u>.
