"I will trust and not be afraid"

We are at that time of year when time flies by very quickly, there is lots to be done and along with all of the upcoming holidays and rejoicing with friends and family, there are more than a few nerve-wracking moments too. Inevitably there might be a "curve ball" thrown at us that might cause us to panic and begin to make up "worst-case-scenarios" in our heads in the blink of an eye without even realizing what we are doing. Any slight change of plans or unexpected occurrences can upset our delicate equilibrium or cause us to fall way behind in regards to activities that go by at break-neck speed.

It is very easy to fall prey to unrealistic expectations about what we actually are able to do in the time-frame that we have been given. Add to that interactions with relatives, spouses, and well meaning friends, it is very easy to become overwhelmed going into what is supposed to be “the most wonderful time of the year.”

This is a good time to remember the first verse of Canticale 9 in place of this Sunday's Psalm (also called “The First Song of Isaiah”) *“Surely it is God who saves me, I will trust in him and not be afraid. For the Lord is my stronghold and my sure defense, and he will be my Savior.”* Let’s face it, a lot of us might find it difficult to get into “holiday-mode” after all that we have been through, trusting that everything will work out. Our first reading this Sunday is also from Isaiah, and is a very hopeful text that tells us God will delight in his people and that *“No more will the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress.”* (Is. 65:19)

As we begin to shift our focus to planning and preparing for the holidays, let us also remember to trust God if we begin to feel anxious or overwhelmed. As we become willing to trust, it will become easier to find peace as we choose to surrender any situations to God and be open to new solutions that appear. Isaiah also tells us that God says *“Before they call, I will answer, and while they are yet speaking, I will hear.”* (Is. 65:24) This tells us that we are not alone and that help is on the way. Let us look for all the ways that we are being helped and blessed this week!

This Week's Lesson: The Shepherds and Jesus' Birth

This week in Sunday School, we studied the wonderful account of the shepherds who were the first to hear the news of Jesus' birth. On a quiet night near Bethlehem, humble shepherds were doing their everyday work—watching over their sheep. Suddenly, the stillness was broken as an angel of the Lord appeared, and the glory of God shone all around them. The shepherds were terrified, but the angel spoke words of comfort: “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord.”

The angel told them that they would find the baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger. Then, a whole company of heavenly angels filled the sky, praising God and declaring: “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests.” The shepherds, filled with awe and excitement, hurried to Bethlehem to see this amazing thing for themselves.

When they arrived, they found Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus just as the angel had said. Their hearts were overflowing with joy. They couldn't keep the good news to themselves—so they spread the word to everyone they met, glorifying and praising God for what they had seen and heard. The shepherds, who were ordinary people with simple jobs, became the first messengers of the Gospel, showing us that God's good news is for all people, not just the rich, powerful, or important.

This story reminds us that God values humility and faith. He didn't choose kings or rulers to be the first witnesses of His Son's birth, but shepherds—the

lowly, the unnoticed, the everyday workers. The message of Jesus is for everyone, no matter who we are.

Takeaway Message: God's love reaches every person, and He often chooses the humble and the ordinary to do extraordinary things. Like the shepherds, we are called to joyfully share the good news of Jesus wherever we go.

Reflection Question: How can we be like the shepherds this week—sharing the joy of Jesus with the people around us?

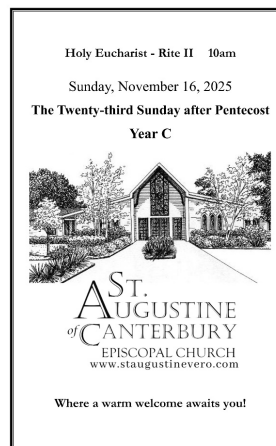
